Sub: Grant of Conditional Permission to the Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya Sakegaon, Tq. Bhusawal Distt. Jalgaon, Maharashtra with 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No. R.17011/135/2018-EP (IM-1) dated 12.10.2018 & 18.12.2018 related to denial of permission for the academic year 2018-19 and rectification for consideration of the case for the academic year 2019-20.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 11-12.03.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs), it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course.

3. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to grant **Conditional Permission to Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya Sakegaon, Tq. Bhusawal Distt. Jalgaon, Maharashtra** for conducting 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2019-20 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to following conditions:

- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of this letter explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- ii. The colleges shall submit undertaking in the form of Affidavit duly notarized to get permanent registration of the Teachers/Hospital Clinical Staff/Consultant in concerned State Boards/Council where the college/hospital is located or Central Registration of the CCIM by 31st December, 2019 as per the decisions conveyed vide letters 22.03.2019 & 22.04.2019 by CCIM and decided by the High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 2369 of 2019, which will be verified by the Council during next visitation while considering the matter for grant/denial of permission for the academic year 2020-21.

4. It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate of the permitted intake capacity of 50 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.


7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2019 to get permission for the session 2020-21:

- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*
8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.



Sub: Issue of Letter of Permission to the “Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sakegaon, N.H.No.-6, Tal-Bhusawal, Distt-Jalgaon-425201, Maharashtra” from the academic session 2020-21 to increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) from 50 seats to 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and grant of conditional Permission for 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 - reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's letter No.L-14014/258/2019-EP-1 dated 13.06.2019 related to admission matter for the academic year 2019-20, intimating certain requirements to be fulfilled by the college for consideration of permission for the academic session 2020-21.

2. Further, to refer application dated 27.08.2019 (received on 30.08.2019 in Ministry) of the Principal, Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sakegaon, N.H.No.-6, Tal-Bhusawal, Distt-Jalgaon-425201, Maharashtra for seeking permission of the Central Govt. for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 50 to 60 seats from the session 2020-21 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 which was forwarded to CCIM vide Ministry's letter dated 10.10.2019. Accordingly, CCIM vide its letter Ref. No. 3-3/2020 Ay. (24) dated 23.09.2020 has issued LOI to increase the intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 50 to 60 seats from the session 2020-21 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

3. Furthermore, refer to the CCIM's letter No.Ref.3-3/2020-Ay.(24) dated 23.09.2020 forwarding therewith recommendation of the college to the Central Government based on thorough examination of the visitation report Part-I, indemnity bond, affidavit & latest details of teaching, non-teaching and hospital staff submitted by the college along with the assessment report, as the physical verification by conduction of inspection could not be carried out in view of present COVID-19 pandemic situation for the A.Y. 2020-21.

4. Further, CCIM vide it's letter Ref.3-3/2020-Ay.(24) dated 23.10.2020 had recommended to Govt. of India to issue LoP for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) from 50 seats to 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course to Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sakegaon, N.H.No.-6, Tal-Bhusawal, Distt-Jalgaon-425201, Maharashtra.

5. On examining the above mentioned CCIM's letters No.Ref.3-3/2020-Ay.(24) dated 23.09.2020 and Ref.3-3/2020-Ay.(24) dated 23.10.2020, it is found that, the college is not fulfilling the requirement related to Website as specified in sub-regulation (2) of regulation 9 of RMS, 2016 and therefore, an opportunity for Hearing/Compliance to update the website by 16.10.2020 was granted to the college under the provision of IMCC Act, 1970. The Compliance submitted by the college and recommendations & assessment report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made there under and it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course as well as for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) from 50 seats to 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course.

6. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to issue **Letter of Permission to "Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sakegaon, N.H.No.-6, Tal-Bhusawal, Distt-Jalgaon-425201, Maharashtra" from the academic session 2020-21 to increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) from 50 seats to 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and grant of conditional Permission for 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to the following:**

- i. The conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college.
- ii. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.

7. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate and post graduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **60 UG (BAMS) seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority of State/UT Government as designated by Central Government vide letter F.No.L.11011/02/2020-EP (1) dated 26.10.2020 for A.Y. 2020-21 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Board of Governors, CCIM and the Central Government.

10. This permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) from 50 to 60 seats as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2020-21 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.





AYU0163) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22 under section 28/29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

2. However, GOI, Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter no. L.14011/3/2020-EP (1) dated 26.03.2021 and 15.04.2021 issued Relaxation/support policy for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the academic session

2021-22 and the permission for the academic year 2021-22 of the ASU&S colleges will be considered on the basis of part-I visitation proforma submitted by the college provided that the college shall submit an undertaking & indemnity bond, stating that they shall fulfill respective requirements in terms of required teaching and training facilities specified in the relevant regulations throughout the academic year".

Further, in view of above, the college has been assessed on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the Ministry of AYUSH and on examining in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criteria for Granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course A.Y. 2021-22.

3. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine to **grant Conditional Permission to Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya Sakegaon, N.H.No-6, Tal-Bhusawal Distt. Jalgaon-425201, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0163) for conducting 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22** subject to the following conditions:-
 - I. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college.
 - II. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
4. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2021 to get permission for the session 2022-23:
 - (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central

- Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
 - (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.
8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2022-23.


With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Chaitanya Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, NH. 
